



# Unisys Hiring for Local Expansion

CHARLESTON -- Governor Joe Manchin joined Unisys Corporation president Teresa DiMarco in announcing the expansion of the company's Charleston operation. According to DiMarco, Unisys is looking for 15 people to process Medicaid claims in West Virginia and surrounding states.

"We're looking for information technology professionals. People who have backgrounds in technology, computer programming and application development."

Anticipating a need for future employees, Unisys is working with the Community and Technical College System of West Virginia to develop a new curriculum to certify participants in Medicaid proficiency. CTCS Chancellor, James Skidmore, says Unisys is looking to the future. "We're going to put a curriculum in place that some of their existing employees will go through. New and potential employees will go through the program. It will prepare them for (the company's) needs in the future."

The medicaid certification will open up career opportunities, not only with Unisys, but with hospitals and insurance companies as well.
